Dear Parishioners,

The four beatitudes in Luke's gospel are followed by four woes. This structure of blessings and woes reminds us of what makes us truly happy and what doesn't, and it is meant to put us on the path to what is lasting. The path to woe is filled with things that are pleasing and attractive, and yet at the same time are superficial. If, for example, we build our life on material riches and buy all the cool stuff, it may be fun for a while, but it doesn't last. Many people who lost their fortunes in this latest economic crisis have learned this lesson the hard way.

Instead, the beatitudes remind us to root our lives in God and the things of God. As Jeremiah the prophet says, "Blessed is the one who trusts in the Lord...He is like a tree planted beside the waters that stretches out its roots to the stream...in the year of drought it shows no distress, but still bears fruit." Each of us experiences desert dryness at times but only the one with faith and deep roots in God survives and even bears good fruit. We need to know and to seek the things of God, things that really last.

## Lenten Practices

**Abstinence** from meat is to be observed  
by all Catholics 14 years old and older on  
Ash Wednesday and on all Fridays of  
Lent.

**Fasting** is to be observed on Ash  
Wednesday by all Catholics who are 18  
years of age but not yet 59. Those who  
are bound by this may take only one full  
meal. Two smaller meals are permitted if  
necessary to maintain strength according  
to one's needs and/or health but eating  
solid foods between meals is not permitted.

By the **threefold discipline** of fasting,  
almsgiving and prayer the Church keeps  
Lent from Ash Wednesday until the evening  
of Holy Thursday. All of the faithful  
and the catechumens should undertake  
serious practice of these three traditions.

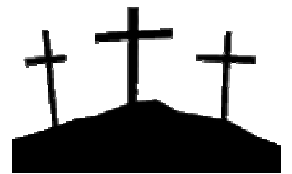

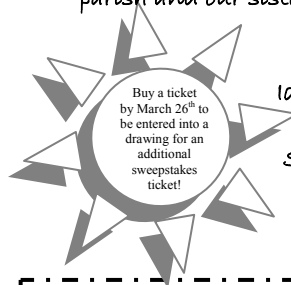
