Dear Parishioners,

Lent again and Lenten practices again. Why do we have to go through this every year? There is an answer to that question at the end of today's Gospel. After Jesus had successfully resisted the temptations of the devil, this Gospel passage ends by stating: "He departed from him for a time." Another translation says: "The devil left him to await another opportunity." "For a time" obviously means there would be other opportunities. As life goes on there are multiple opportunities to be tempted to do what we know we need to avoid, and sometimes we weaken, give in and get off track of the way we want to live. Lent is a way to help us get back on track.

This special season of God's grace invites us to open ourselves to God's presence. Throughout the year we find that we open our lives to some things that are harmful, and now is the time to listen openly to God calling us to what is life-giving. Our Lenten practices are our response to that call. As Jesus went into the desert filled with the Holy Spirit so we too need to enter into the "desert" of Lent knowing that the Holy Spirit is with us along the way.

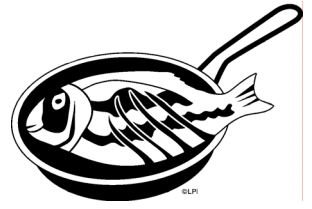

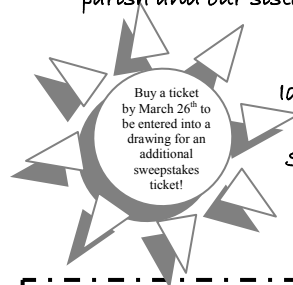
