The first reading and Gospel today focus on hospitality. The hospitable person makes a place for and attends to the needs of the guests. It consists of both the physical activity of cleaning the house and cooking a meal as well as making an inner space in one's mind and heart for the guest. It would be inhospitable to neglect either one. In the gospel story of Martha and Mary we see Mary sitting at the feet of Jesus and Martha "burdened with much serving." Sometimes we can be overly active, but Martha and Mary do not represent an either/or choice, rather both are necessary. Guests need to be received in both ways.

In our overactive world this serves as a good reminder to make a space inside not only for one another but also for God. When we fail to do so, we easily become scattered in multiple tasks and fail to receive or be attentive to others or God.

On a personal note, after nine years as your pastor I want you to know that I greatly appreciate how hospitable and supportive you have been to me. 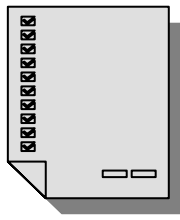

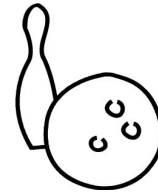
