What do we see when we look at other people? We could see the clothes they wear and their overall appearance; we could see what we have heard about them from others or what impression they make upon us; or we could see their hearts and who they really are in their hopes, dreams and their potential. These considerations may be what motivated Jesus to ask his host Simon: "Do you see this woman?" about the woman who came into the dining room and bathed his feet with her tears, wiped them with her hair and anointed them with ointment. All Simon saw was a woman who was known to be a sinner. What Jesus saw was a woman who loved much and desired forgiveness.

Chances are our sight needs to improve when it comes to looking at other people and even at ourselves. Our judgments, prejudice and bias can keep us from seeing who a person really is and miss what is most important about him or her or about ourselves. Jesus sees into the heart and sees all of who we are, and he loves the person he sees. We are called to do the same.
