Dear Parishioners,

Contrary to what some may think and/or say, God does not want the death and destruction of the sinner. God wants repentance and change. The stories in the gospel today are about those who died when a tower fell on them and those who were killed by an order of Pilate. The people who asked Jesus about them judged that they died because of their wickedness. Jesus replied with an emphatic "NO," that is not true. He said that if God acted like that they would all be dead because they were all sinners. Then he told the story of a barren fig tree in the garden that was given another year to bear fruit. God wants our conversion and works for our repentance so that we might choose to live according to God's will.

There is a lesson in that for all of us. God continues to call us to repentance, to a change in life concerning all that is not in accordance with the will of God. Repentance, change, is not usually easy. We have the season of Lent to get started on it, to turn our hearts and minds to God. Our repentance will lead us on a passage to new life.

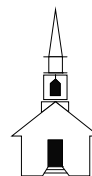

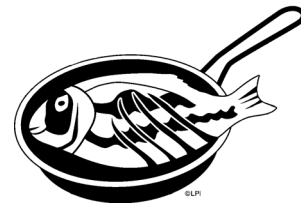
