In November, Entheos began the process of reviewing the current parish facilities and interviewing ministry leaders and staff to determine the facilities that will be needed for future parish growth and development. Parishioners will have the opportunity to hear the results of this initial information gathering and to add their input on the future needs of St. Joseph University Parish in a "town hall" meeting to be held between Masses at 10:15 am on Sunday, January 21, 2018 in the Gregorian Room. The purpose of the meeting will be to share what the architects heard in these parish interviews and Long Range Planning Committee discussions to date. It is purely a confirmation/discussion of current and future facility needs. There will not be any designs or floor plans at this presentation as we must first all agree on our future needs and goals. We hope you will join us in helping to shape the future of St. Joseph University Parish.
